I am grateful to be accorded this opportunity to officiate at the launch of the Lubuto Library Project at Ngwerere Basic School. As a Ministry, we have put emphasis on the value and contribution libraries can make to the education of our children.

School, a Library is an indispensable resource which establishes an environment for continued learning outside classroom.

Ladies and Gentlemen,

Research has shown that the levels of reading ability among Zambian basic School pupils are dangerously The development of reading skills and the formation of reading habits are heavily dependent on availability of suitable and varied reading materials. Hence, the presence and active use of School Library can be said to boost pupils' reading achievement. Further, the virtual impossibility of developing a reading culture in the absence of libraries has retarded the development of both local authorship and the contribution to the publishing industry. This therefore, poses a great challenge to nurture and preserve literacy skills gained by our pupils in Schools, by disseminating of suitable reading materials especially in rural areas.

Ladies and Gentlemen,

The Lubuto Library Project is a partner to the Ministry of Education who has come up with the model of construction using indigenous styled libraries for orphans and vulnerable children in Zambia including the local community. I am informed that this Library Project supplies libraries

an initial collection of books organized with according to a specially developed classification scheme, trains staff to maintain the libraries and offer user services, arranging for programs and acquisition of relevant local publications. therefore, evident that this library project will strive give children in this local community opportunity to participate in the informal education improvement of literacy, language skills and above all accord children the sense of self-worth and general knowledge of their own environment and the world at large. With this responsibility, I would like to implore the host School to work closely with the project in order to achieve the ideals of the project in Ngwerere Basic School. It should not be taken as a project but an integral part of the School system for the benefit of both pupils and those out of School in the local community.

Ladies and Gentlemen,

With these few remarks, I would like to take this rare opportunity to officially launch the Opening of Ngwerere Basic School Lubuto Library. This library will go a long way to benefit all our children in their locality and subsequently improve the literacy levels, reduce poverty and mitigate the scourge of HIV/AIDS through literacy empowerment.
